Our programs did not overlook the prisons health situation and mental health of prisoners, in collaboration with the relevant government authorities, local and international organizations, with the aim of reducing the spread of diseases and epidemics among prisoners and create a healthy and safe environment for prisoners through WASH program, hygiene campaigns, providing of water tanks & filters, provision of personal hygiene tools for prisons and prisoners, in conjunction with the shelter and non-food items programs which target the prisoners' residence through provision of mattresses, blankets and sheets, billows and else, also rehabilitation and furnishing of kitchens, installation of solar energy systems for prisons, distribution of seasonal clothes, and giving washing machines to prisoners and prisoners.

NPF also sought to rehabilitate the skills of prisoner through capacity-building programs and community-based rehabilitation so to enable prisoners to overcoming their hard living condition after release and reintegrating easily within community as NPF mission is part and parcel of Prisons' Organization mission, and NPF activities and programs support its educational, correctional and behavioral efforts meant to adjust the criminal behavior to some prisoners to avoid future criminal acts. Thus, NPF will assist in society protection against the evils and the risks the heinous crime that may prevent the destabilization of social security, stability, peace and tranquility. We in the same time aspire more support, as the size of need within the large prisons require much more and co-ordinated response to be able to meet all needs.

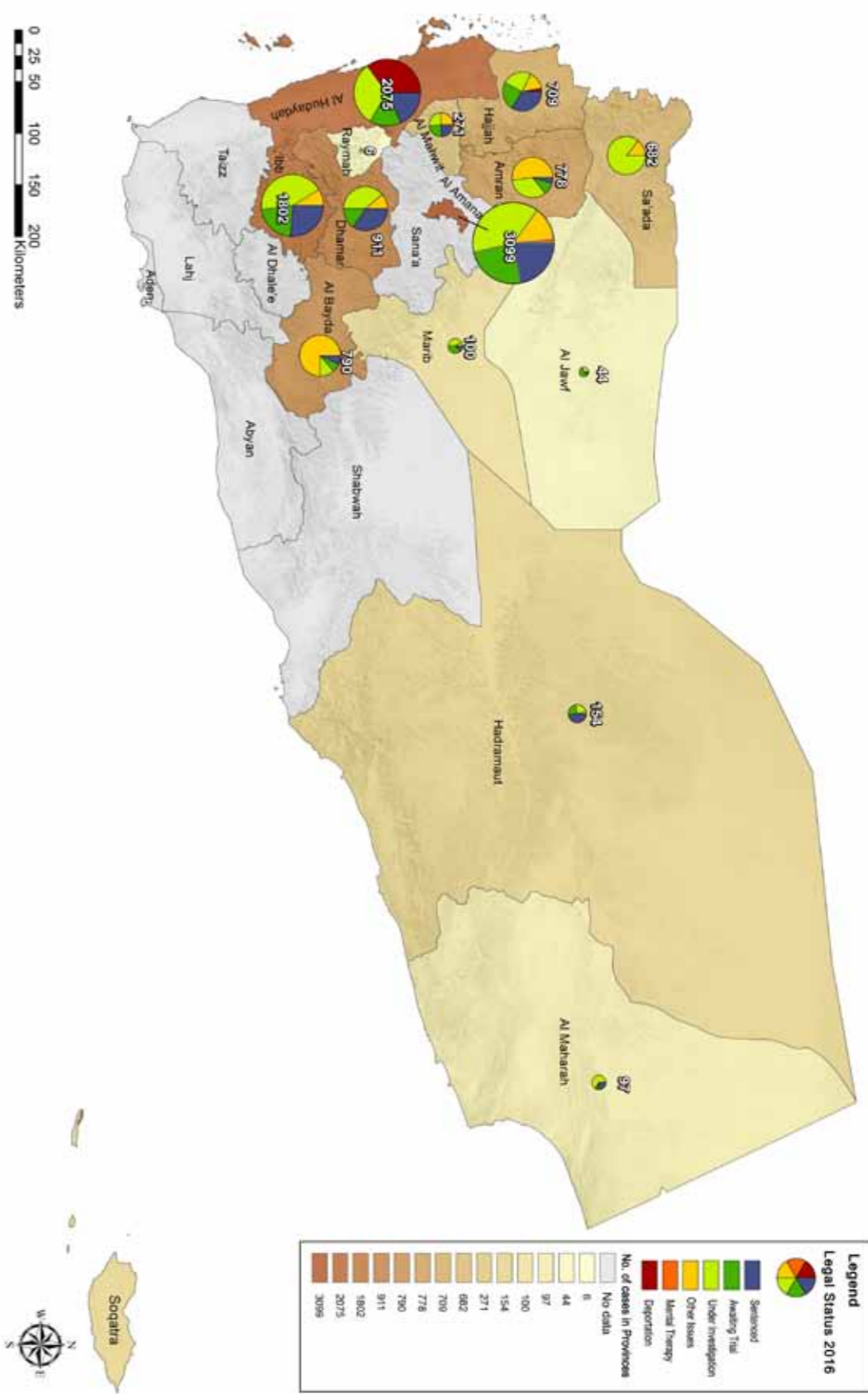

Figure: Numbers of male and female prisoners in the Central Correction

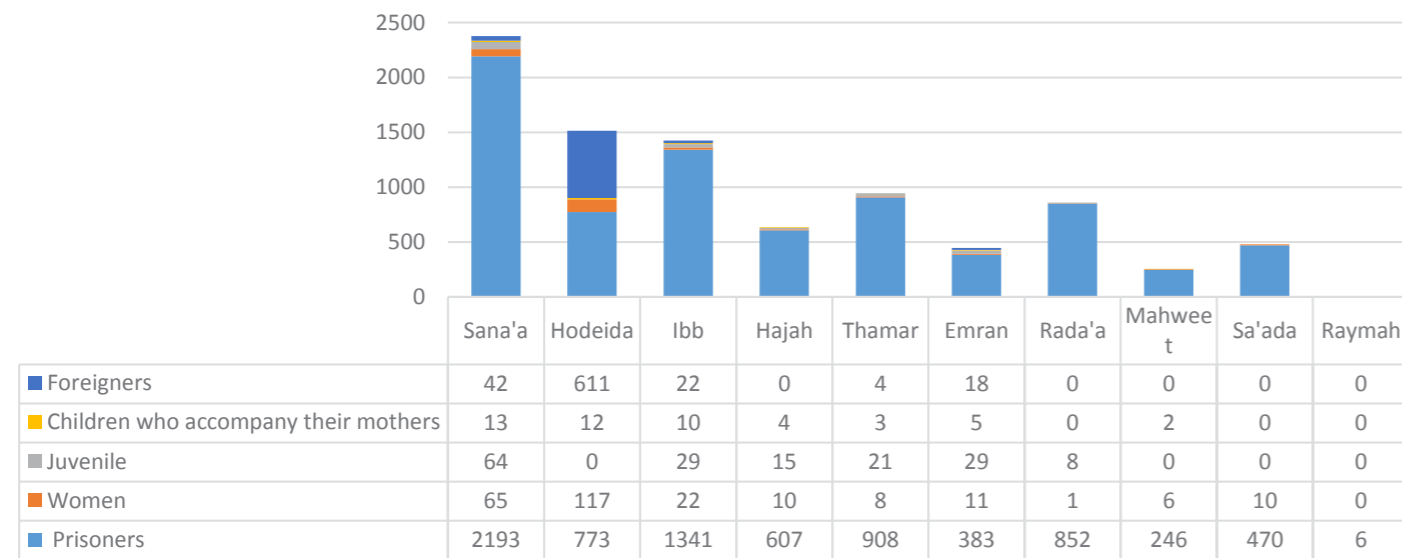
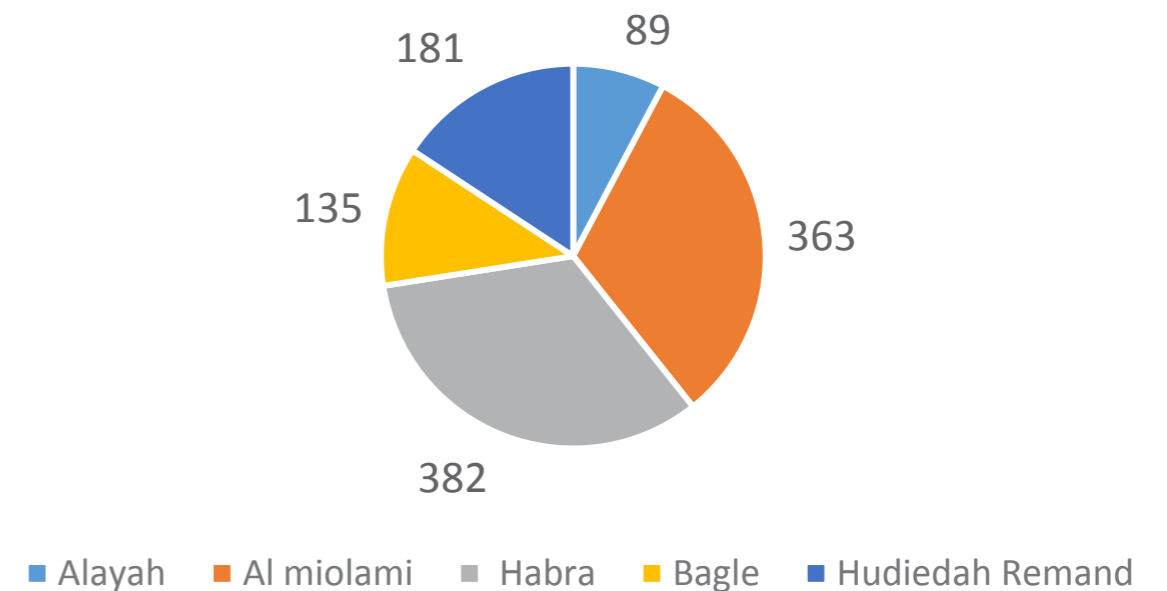


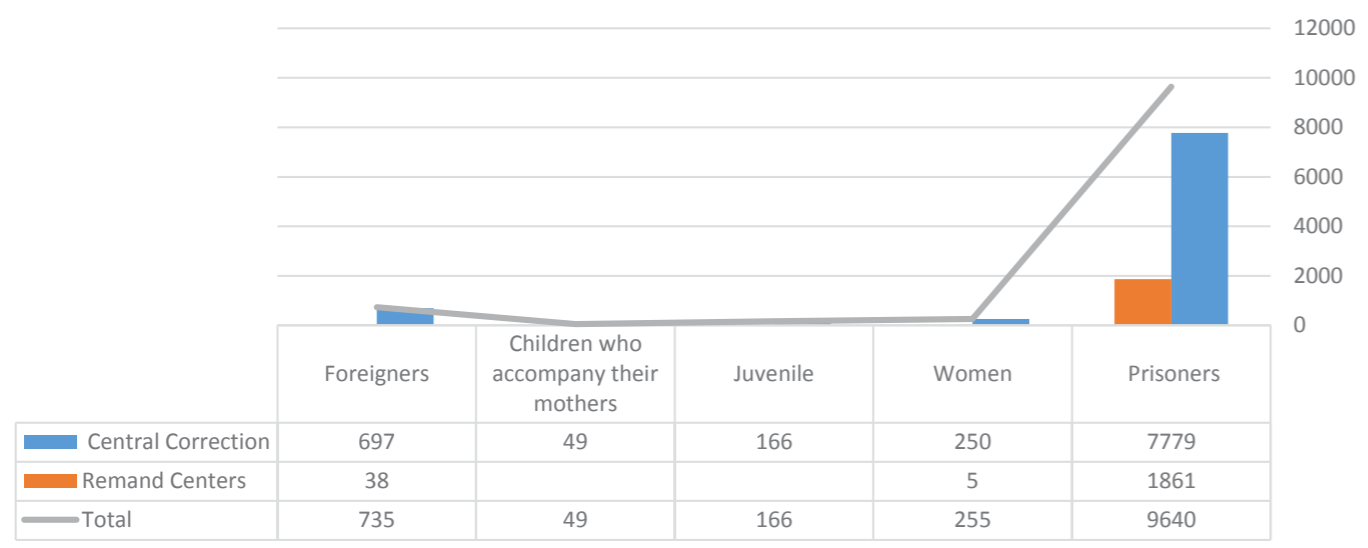
Figure: Numbers of male and female prisoners in Remand Centers

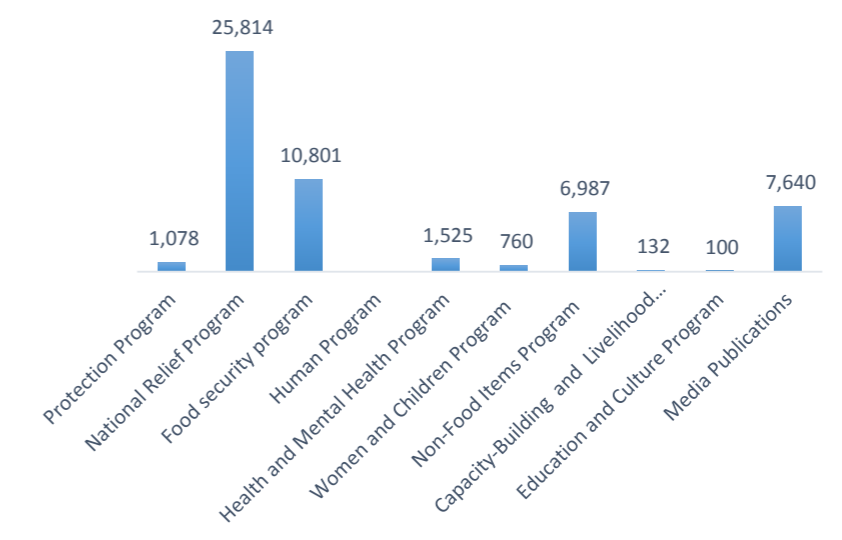

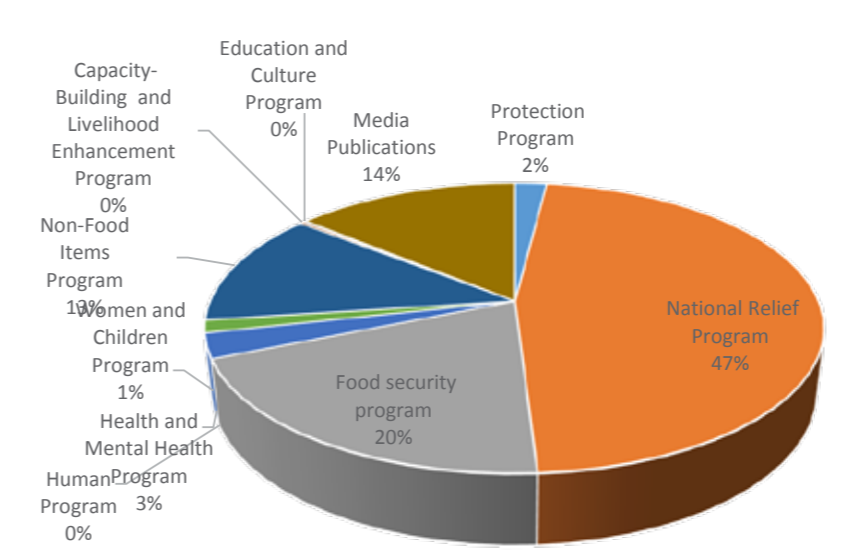

Protection Program aims to provide rights protection for male female, juvenile prisoners and the accompanying children in accordance with the related international human rights provisions and conventions, assist the prisoners to realize their rights and fulfill their duties, and help the concerned authorities to implement prisoners right, finalize the pending cases in courts, and monitor human rights violations in prisons that endanger the lives of prisoners to be addressed in cooperation with the appropriate authorities and concerned local and international NGOs.

Program Target Beneficiaries:

(Prisoners- Prison authorities and working staff- Concerned about Prisons).

Program Objectives:

- To pay instead of the insolvent prisoners who have completed the common right and remained in prison due to inability to pay the special right (End Insolvency)
- To plead and defend for poor prisoners' pending issues in the courts and prosecutions (Legal Assistance).
- To legally counsel and advise female and male prisoners and for their legal representatives who follow up on their cases.
- Provision of psychosocial support to prisoners and female prisoners and their families to contribute in easing the negative impact of the prison.
- Dissemination of social peace through reconcile the differences between the prisoner and rightful claimant.
- To contribute to combating violence against women and children through activating the international laws which ensure their legal rights.
- To improve the mental picture of prisoners and their families in the surrounding community.
- Monitor and report and human rights violations within prisons or courts.





Insolvent Prisoners Assistance Project

What's Insolvent Prisoners Assistance Project?

We seek, through “Insolvent Prisoner Assistance” to help insolvent prisoners to get released, paying off their private rights (amounts due to others), after they serve entire sentences and meet selection criteria and assistance conditions.

Implementation Phases:



Collecting Data Phase: In this phase, a team of NPF’s lawyers carry out field surveys in central prisons and corrections on insolvent prisoners’ issues and receive insolvent prisoners’ issues at NPF headquarter.



Selection Phase: In this phase, a committee of legal experts, headed by Director of the Department of Legal Affairs, checks out the collected insolvent prisoners’ information to select states that meet assistance conditions and selection criteria.



Phase of Reconciliation between Prisoners and Rights holders: At this phase, NPF team negotiates with rights holders to persuade them giving up some of the amounts that the prisoners due according to the sentences issued by prosecutions and courts, and tries converging views to resolve the dispute between the prisoner and the right holder.



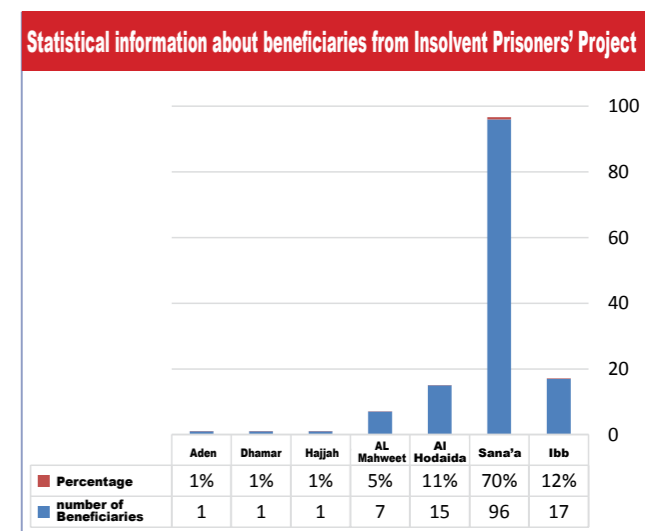
Phase of Fundraise and Payment: In such phase, NPF launches a campaign to raise funds from philanthropists, businessmen, and companies in favor of insolvent prisoners.



Release Phase: After raising funds, NPF team pays amounts on insolvent prisoners’ behalf; NPF pays through prosecutions and courts, deposit required funds in insolvents’ balances at the public prosecution, or directly deliver cash payment to the right holder after the closure of the case file. Finally, NPF gets the release order.

- 1 Prisoner’s debt shall be fixed on the basis of peremptory judicial verdict .
 - 2 Prisoner due pay shall be based on legal work and the insolvency shall be proved.
 - 3 The debtor shall be a prisoner under due pay.
 - 4 A copy of the judicial verdict shall be provided.
 - 5 Prisoner shall not be manipulator or deceiver before or after the verdict.
 - 6 Debts shall not be accumulated on the basis of crime committed by free will or for the purpose of money attainment.
 - 7 The prisoner shall not be released after paying off on his/her behalf and was jailed again due to new due debts.
