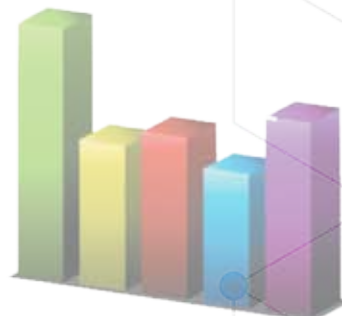

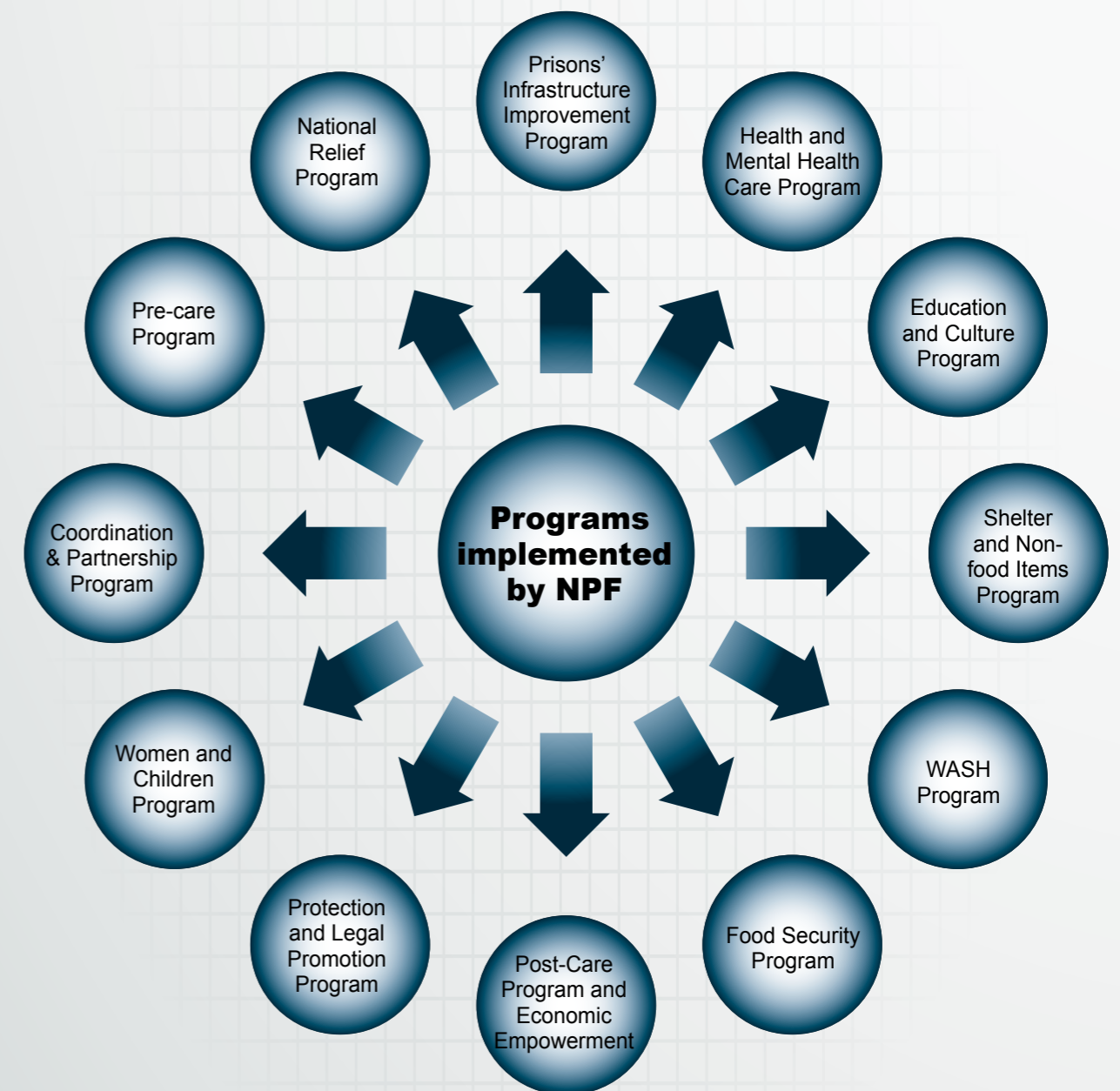

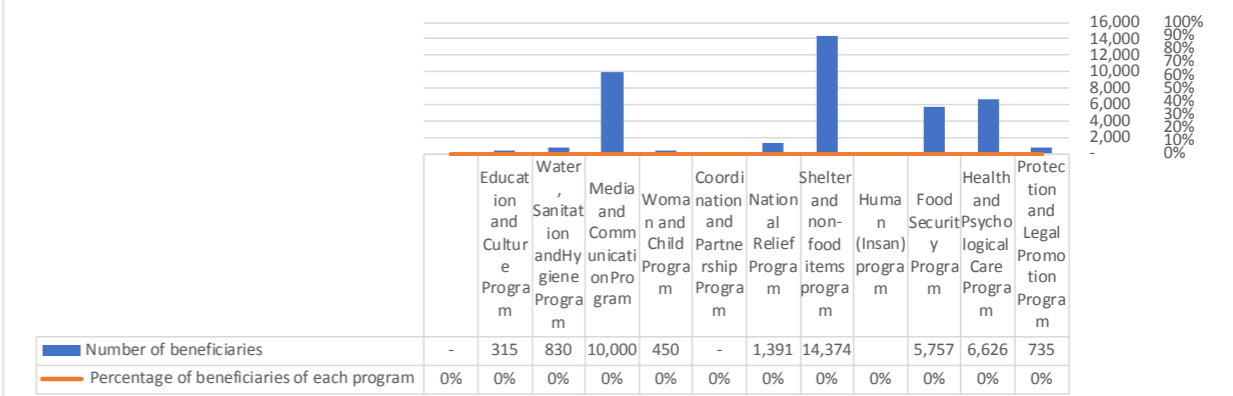

## Project assist insolvent prisoners

### Project Idea

We aim through the project to adopt the issues of prisoners who are insolvent on the basis of the special rights they have after they have completed the public right in case they are subject to the conditions of assistance and criteria of differentiation and payment of their special rights.

### Project implementation stages



**Field survey and reception of cases of insolvent cases:** At this stage, the field survey of the cases of male and female prisoners in the Central Correctional Facilities is carried out by a team of lawyers affiliated with the Foundation and the reception of the cases of the insolvent in the Foundation's headquarters



**Study files and data analysis:** At this stage, the committee composed of legal persons, headed by the Director of the Legal Affairs Department of the Foundation, will study the cases of the insolvent who were surveyed and received in the Foundation and make sure that they comply with the conditions of assistance and subject them to the standards of differentiation through that human and legal situation of male and female prisoners are taken into account.



**Convergence of views between male prisoner /female prisoner and right holder:** At this stage the rights holders are being contacted to waive some of the amounts that the prisoners have under the judgments issued by the prosecutions and the courts and the convergence of views to resolve the dispute and resolve the problems between the prisoner and the right holder due to the case.



**Payment of amounts for insolvent male and female prisoners:** At this stage the project is marketed for philanthropists, businessmen, trading companies and society to collect, donations in favor of the insolvent and paying their own rights.



**Release of insolvent male and female prisoners:** After providing the amounts which should be paid by the prisoners through the prosecutions and courts or transfer of amounts to the accounts of the insolvent in the Public Prosecution and pay directly to the right holder after closing the case file in the competent authorities and writing the release order.

### Conditions for acceptance to assist insolvent prisoners

- 1) The financial amount is fixed on the prisoner by a final judgment.
- (2) The prisoner is held free in the amount of the sentence.
- 3) Attach an accredited copy of the judicial verdict.
- 4) The prisoner should not be one of the former perpetrators or is not loyal to pay to the right holders.
- (5) The amount awarded shall not be due to a crime committed in bad faith.
- 6) That the payment has not been paid to the prisoner previously and returned to prison in a new crime or debt.



## Project Legal aid project

### The Summary of Project

Legal aid project aims to advocate for male and female prisoners' issues by seeking to activate the laws that ensure the rights of the prisoner in various fields, and enact laws contribute for prisoner rights and to plead the male and female prisoners' pending issues in the prosecution offices and courts, and legal advice, and strengthen the principle of accountability to ensure that the prisoner obtains his rights guaranteed by domestic and international law.

### Project Goals

- Seeking to activate domestic and international laws and regulations relating to the rights of male and female prisoners, juvenile prisoners and children accompanying their mothers in prison.
- Holding workshops, symposiums and seminars to come out with visions and proposals that contribute to the enactment of laws of legislation that will bring justice to the prisoner in various aspects.
- Provide legal advice to male and female prisoners, and individuals subject to legal accountability.
- Promote community-based accountability to ensure that prisoners have access to all their guaranteed rights.

### Stages of implementation of the legal aid project (Advocacy for prisoners):

Field survey and reception of legal aid cases:

At this stage, a field survey team is formed from lawyers and jurists to go to Central Correctional Facilities and Detention Centers to make a survey for the issues that need to be intervened.

Study files and data analysis:

At this stage, the Legal Aid Committee will study and analyse the files that have been scanned or received in the Foundation for the purpose of matching them with the conditions of accepting the assistance of the legal aid and clarifying the issues that coincided with those conditions.

Conducting the differentiation between applicants: If candidates are more than the absorptive capacity of the Foundation, applicants are subject to the criteria of differentiation, which takes into account all aspects of the prisoner's humanitarian aspects.

Pleading before Prosecutions and Courts:

At this stage, cases that need follow-up will be distributed to the Foundation's volunteers' team to attend trial sessions and follow-up cases in the prosecutions and courts until they are decided.

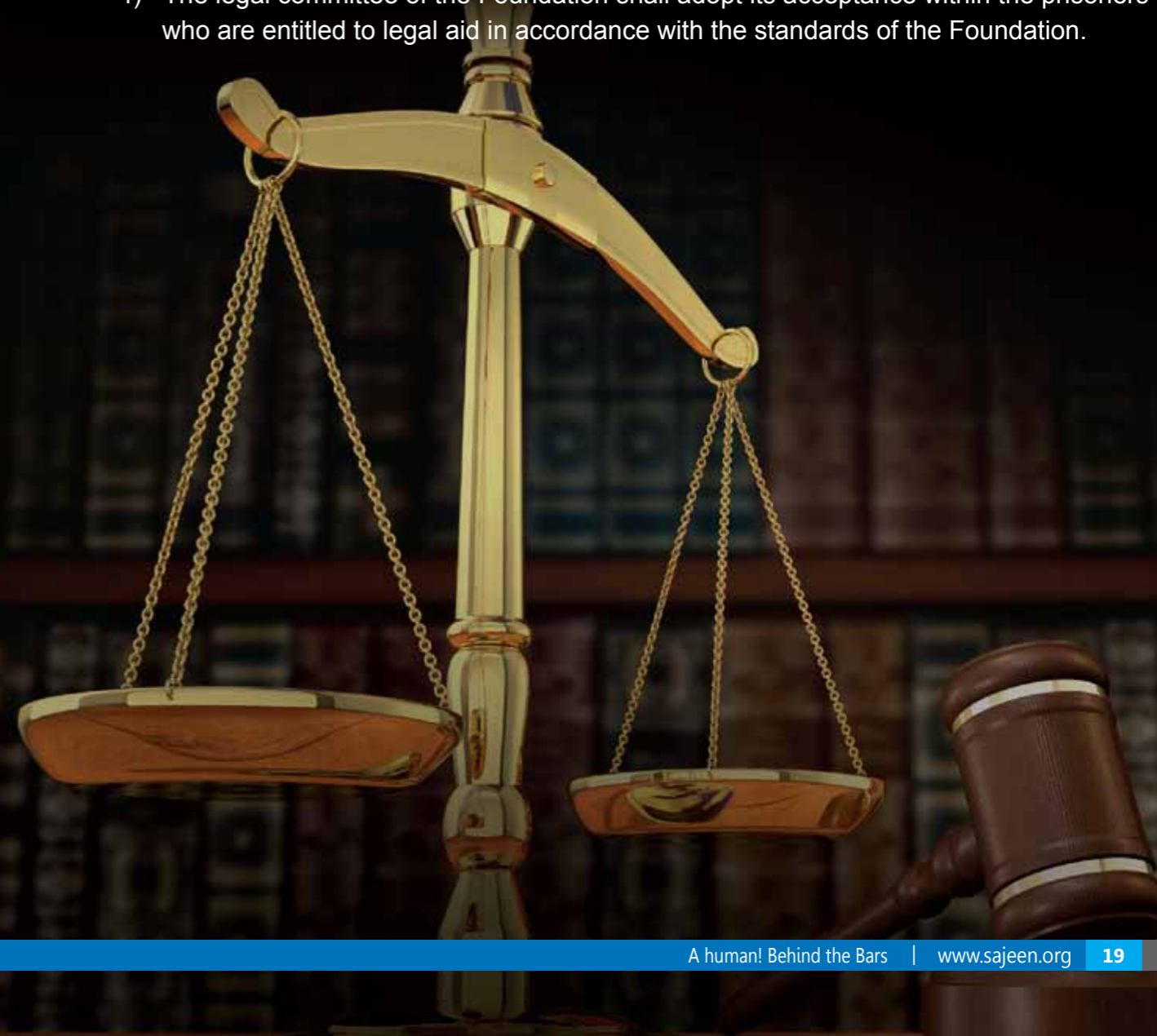
Discuss obstacles to the implementation of the project: The Management of the Foundation will sit periodically with the Committee of legal aid and lawyers to find out the most important updates in the purpose of benefiting, and find the necessary solutions for the difficulties encountered by the project team.

## Conditions for accepting assistance in legal aid

- 1) The beneficiary of the legal aid is a prisoner in need of assistance.
- 2) The case of the prisoner is still visible to the concerned authorities.
- 3) The prisoner should not be one of the former perpetrator.
- 4) The legal committee of the Foundation shall adopt its acceptance within the prisoners who are entitled to legal aid in accordance with the standards of the Foundation.

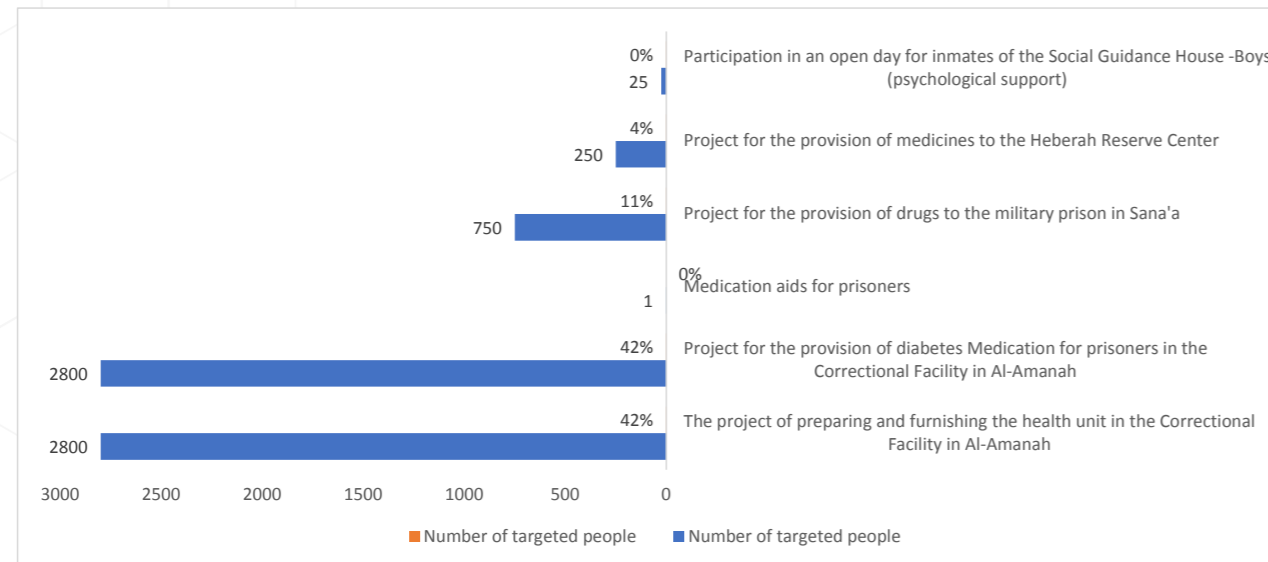

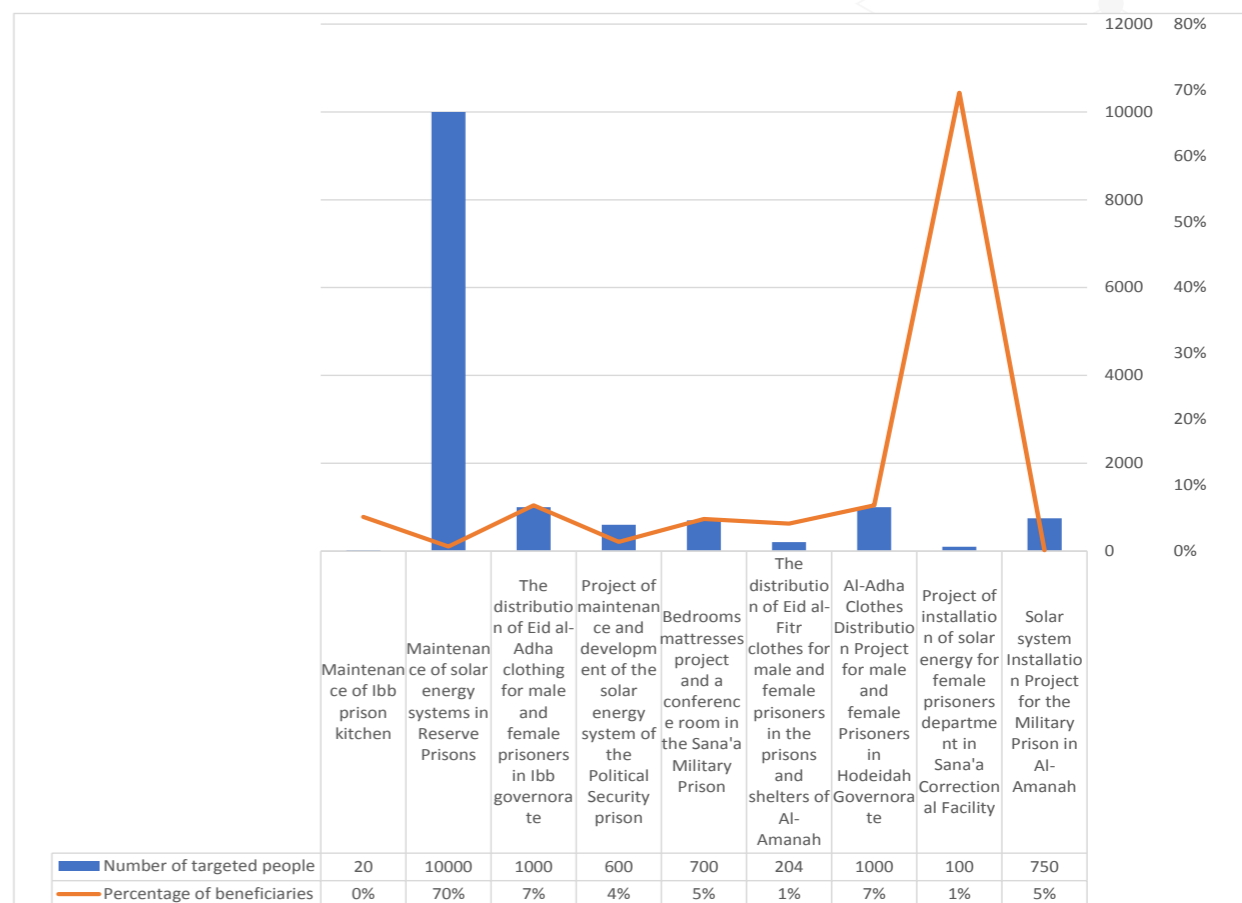

The distribution of water and hygiene tools to the Reserve Detention Centers

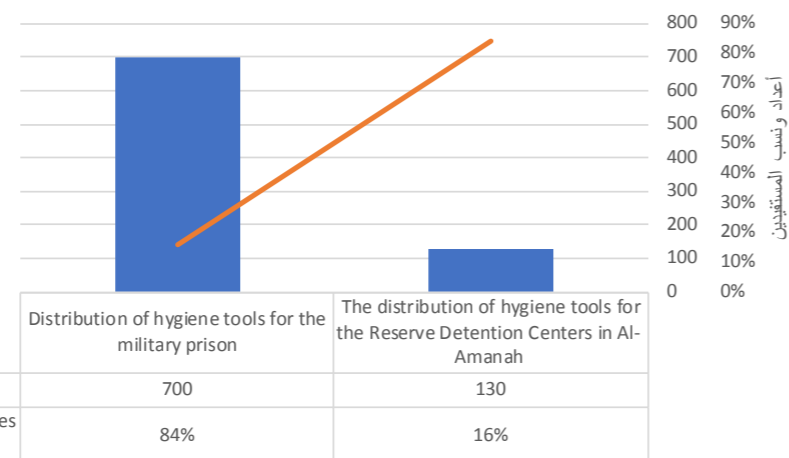

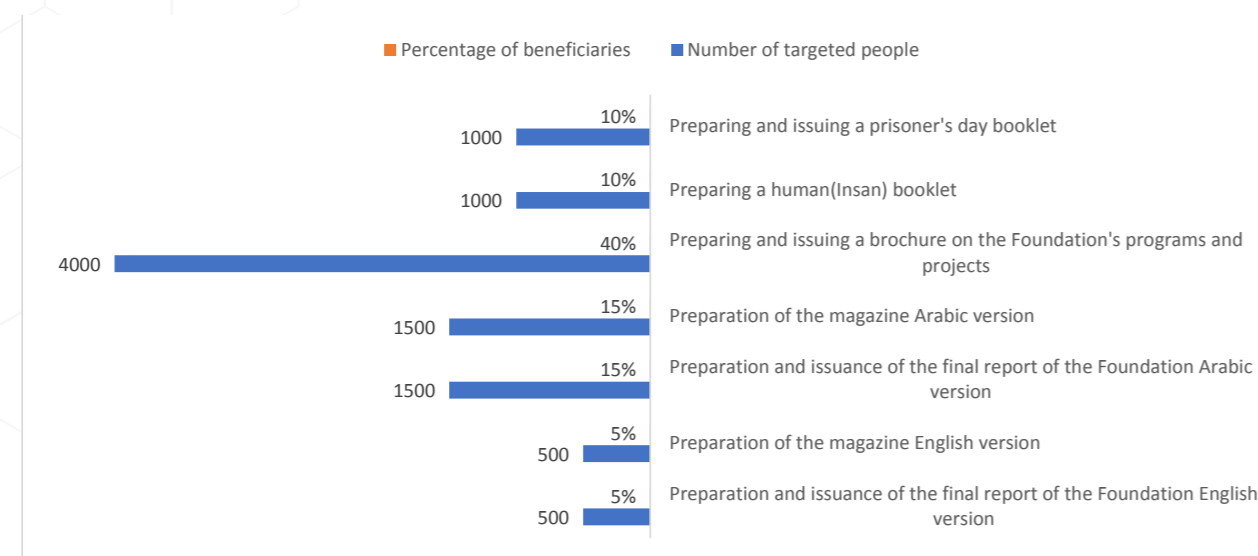


We believe in the importance of media Message; the National Prisoner Foundation regularly publishes media versions such as:
